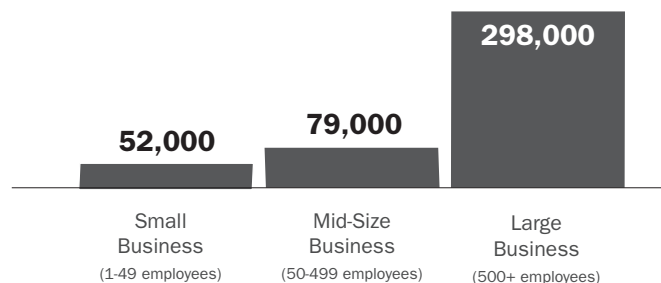

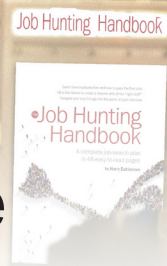
ONE-MONTH CHANGE IN HIRES BY BUSINESS SIZE

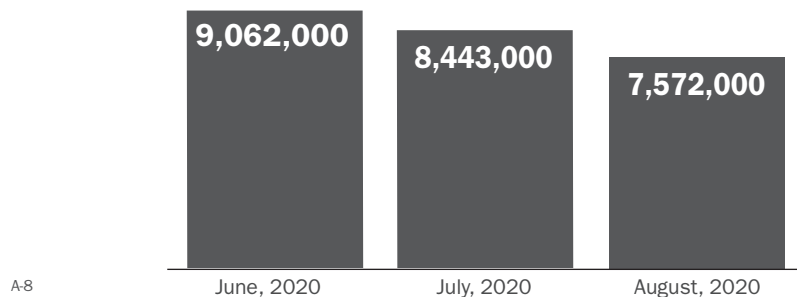

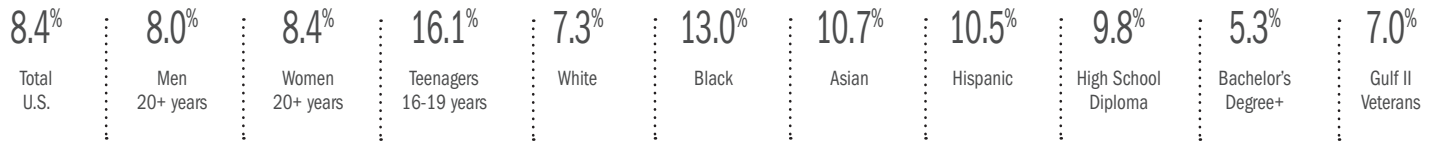

UNEMPLOYMENT RATES IN AUGUST, 2020 ¹

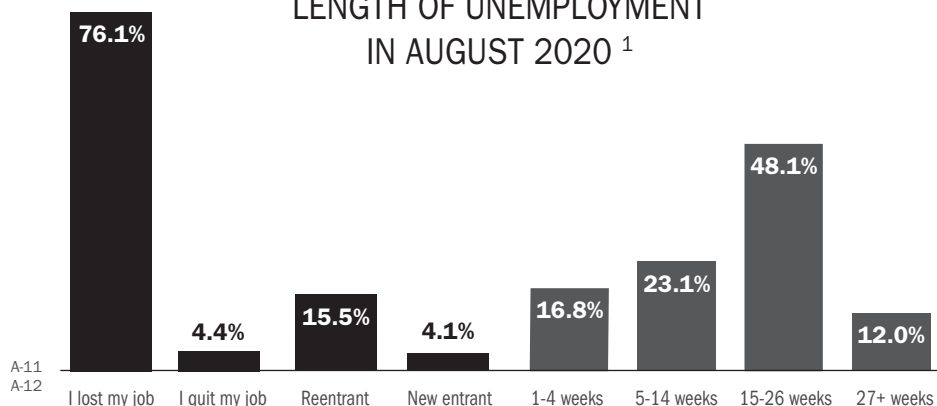

REASON FOR UNEMPLOYMENT & LENGTH OF UNEMPLOYMENT IN AUGUST 2020 ¹

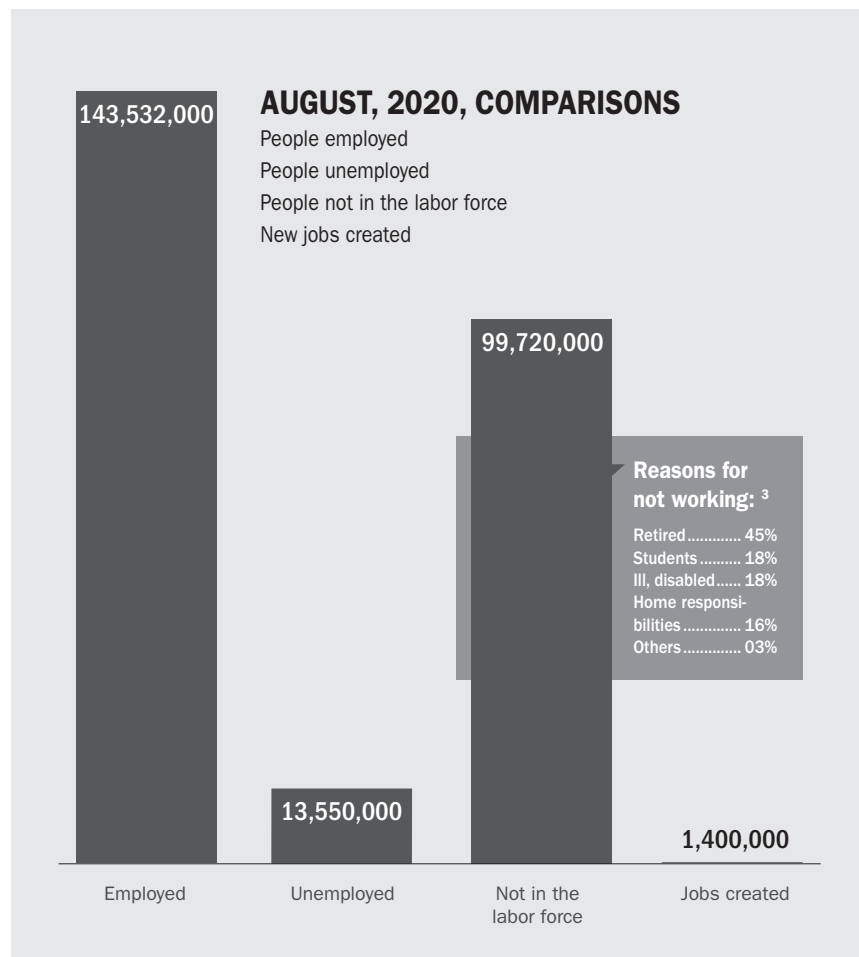
