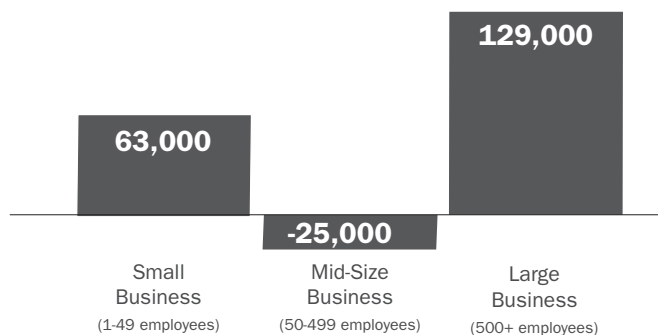

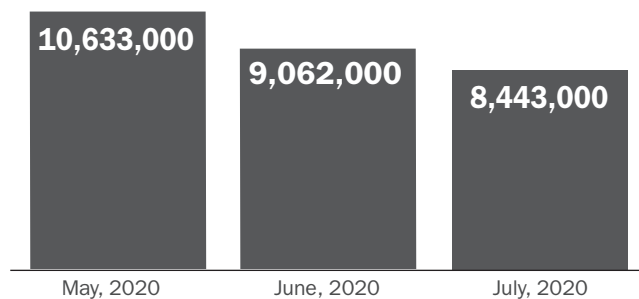

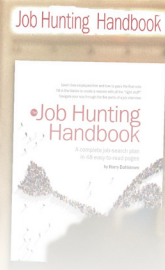

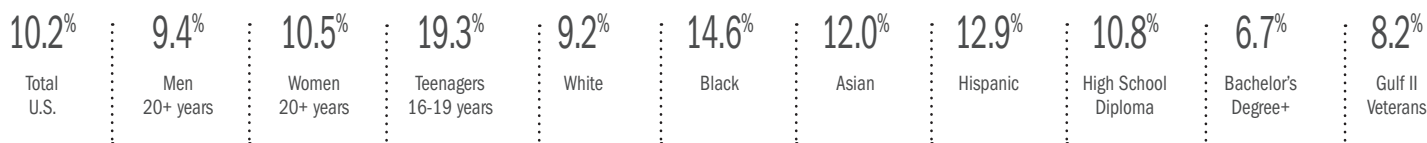

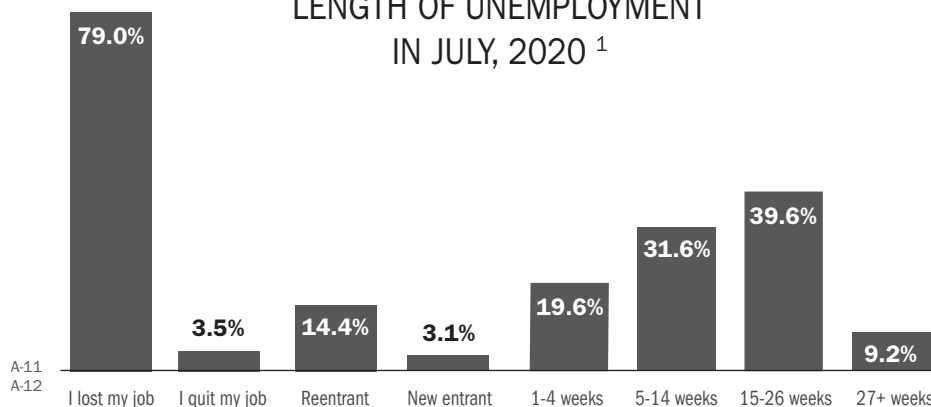
UNEMPLOYMENT RATES IN JULY, 2020 ¹



UNEMPLOYMENT BY OCCUPATION ¹

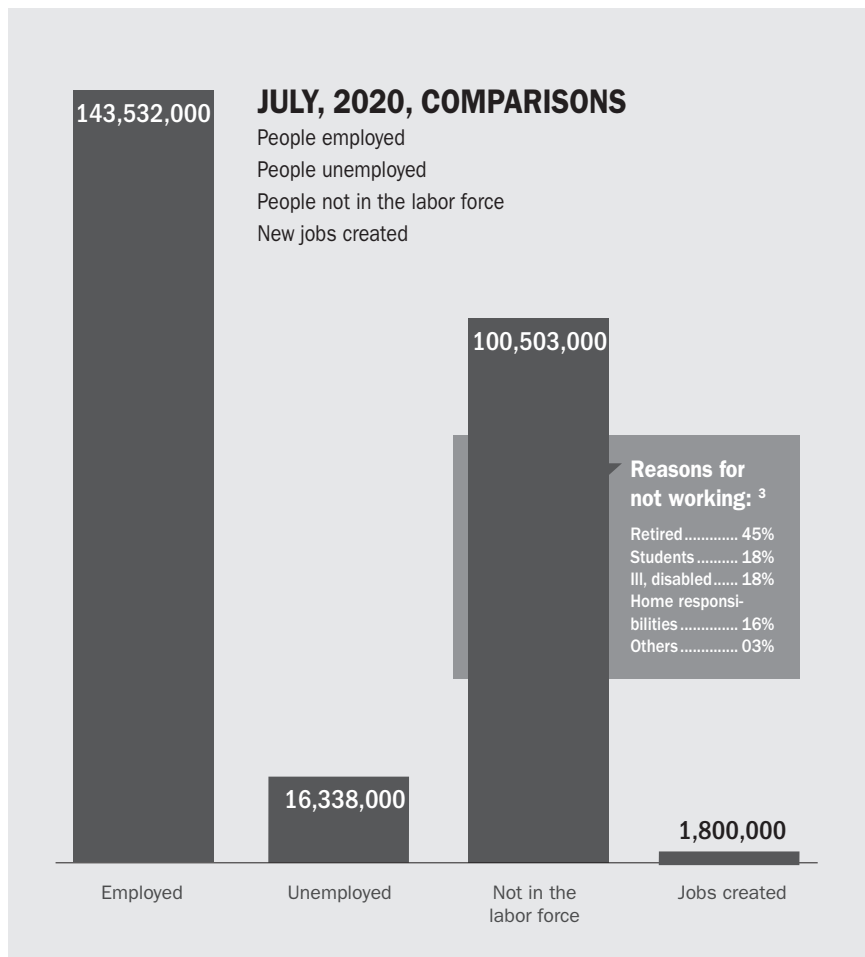
