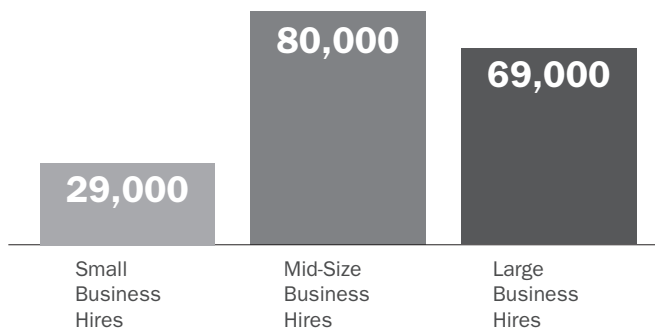

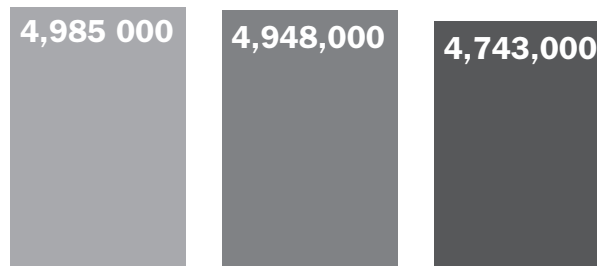

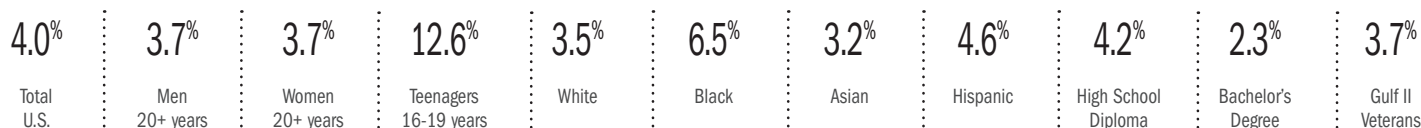

### JUNE 2018, UNEMPLOYMENT RATES <sup>1</sup>



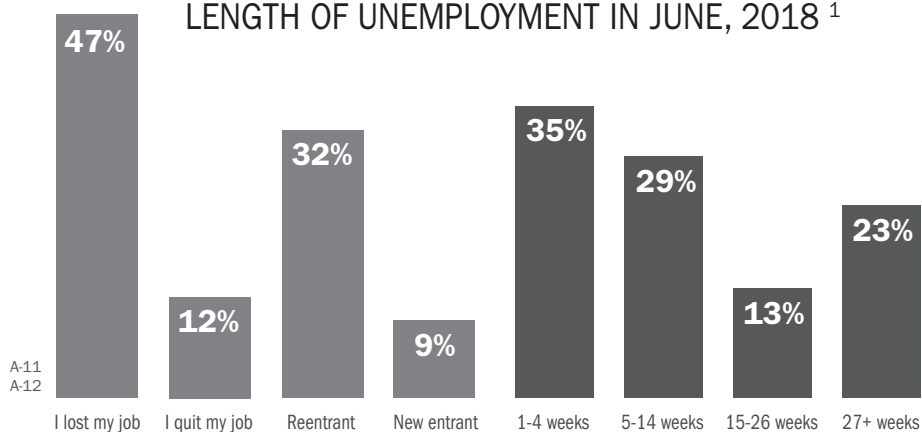

### REASON FOR JOB LOSS & LENGTH OF UNEMPLOYMENT IN JUNE, 2018 <sup>1</sup>

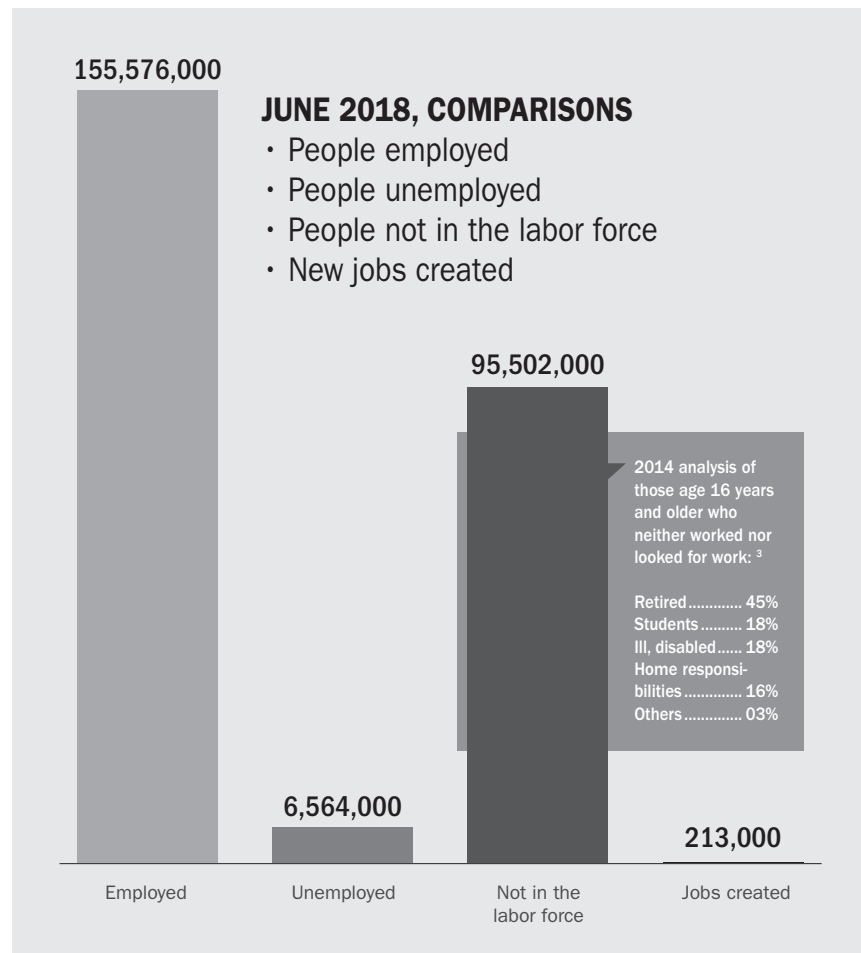
