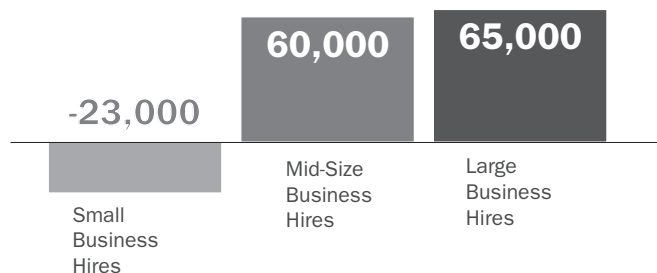

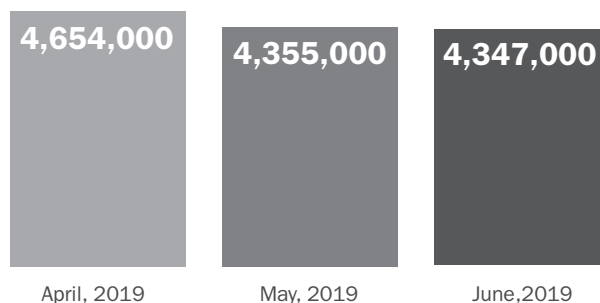

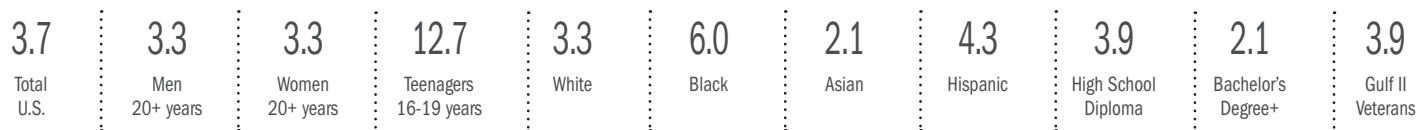

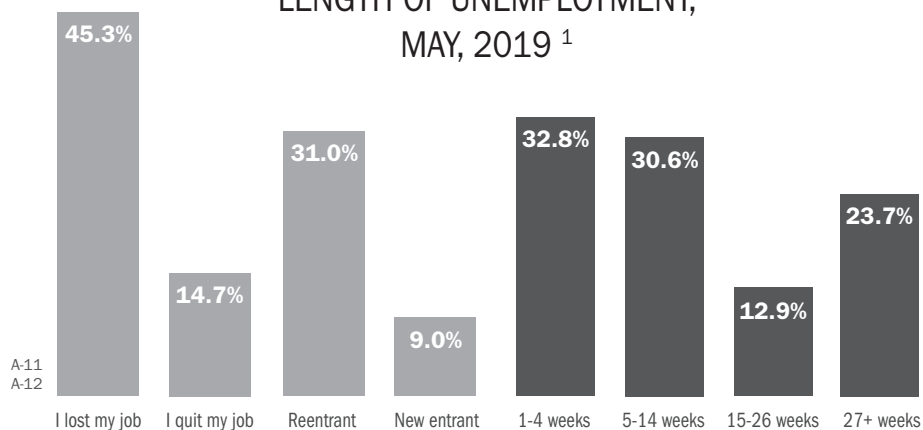

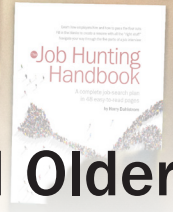

### REASON FOR JOB LOSS & LENGTH OF UNEMPLOYMENT, MAY 2019<sup>1</sup>

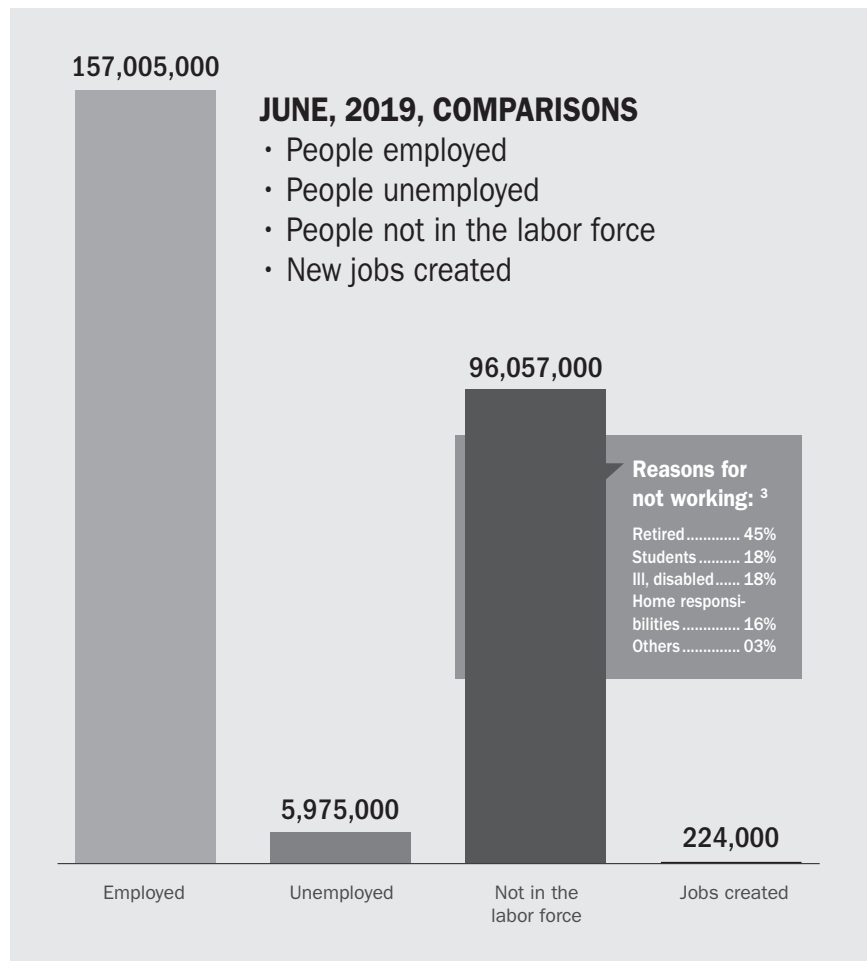
