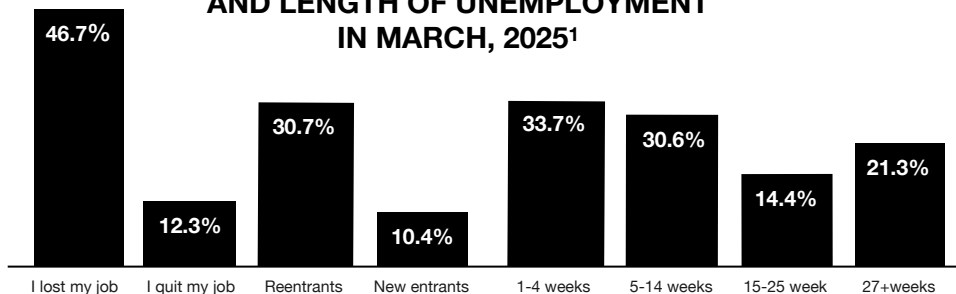

### REASON FOR UNEMPLOYMENT AND LENGTH OF UNEMPLOYMENT IN MARCH, 2025<sup>1</sup>



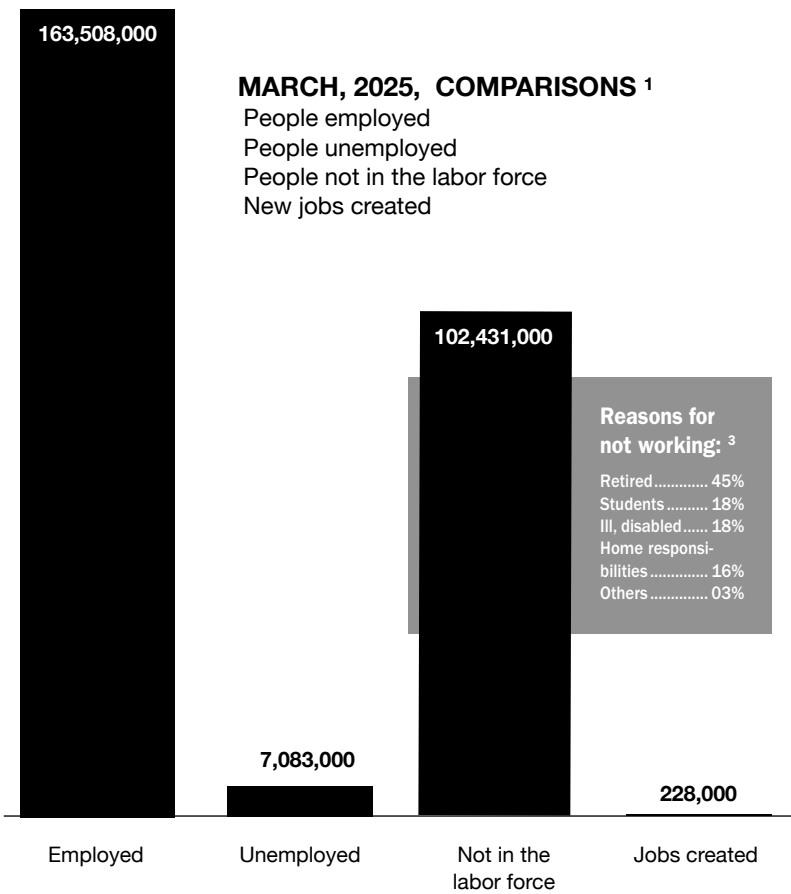
