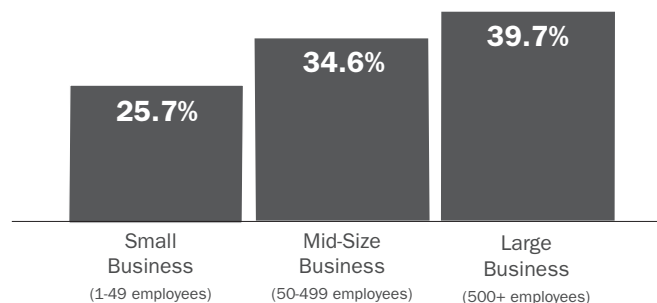

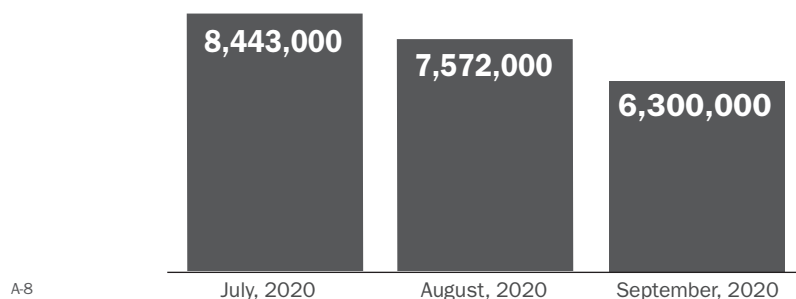

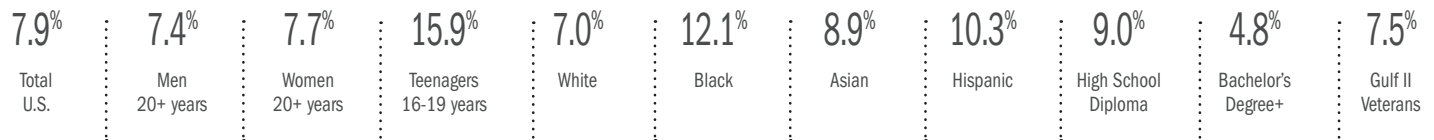

UNEMPLOYMENT RATES IN SEPTEMBER, 2020 ¹

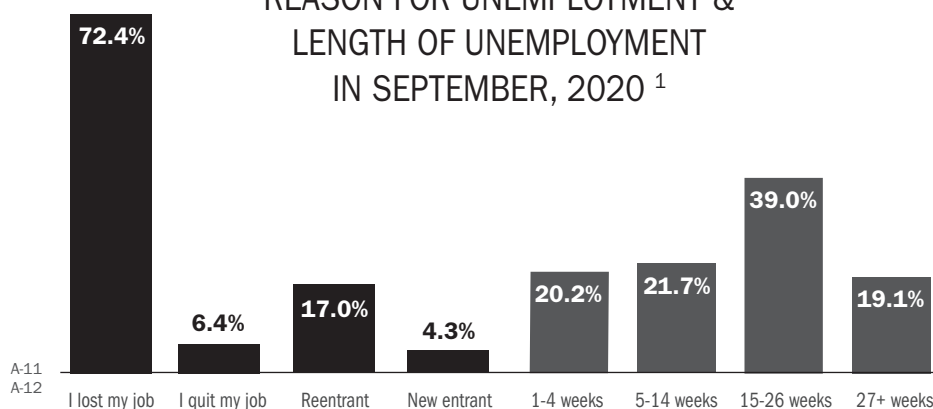

REASON FOR UNEMPLOYMENT & LENGTH OF UNEMPLOYMENT IN SEPTEMBER, 2020 ¹

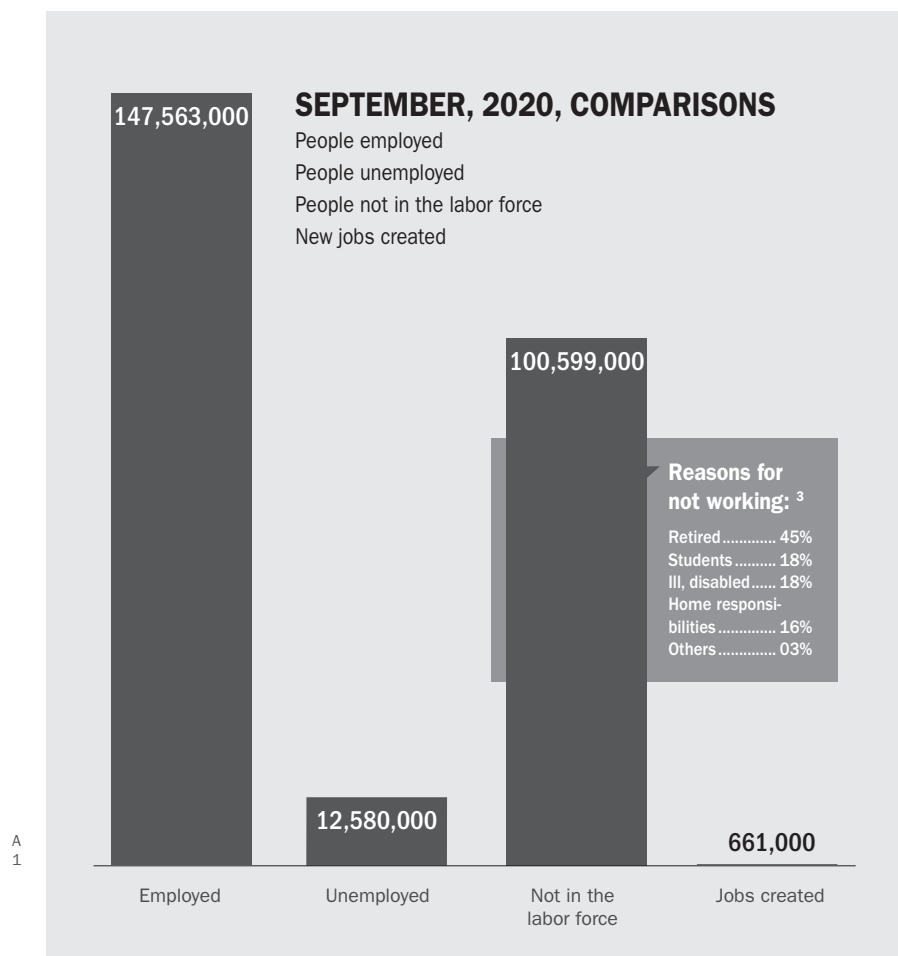
