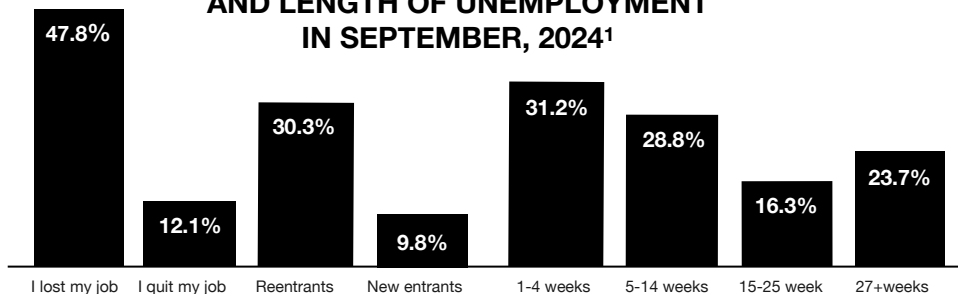

REASON FOR UNEMPLOYMENT AND LENGTH OF UNEMPLOYMENT IN SEPTEMBER, 2024¹



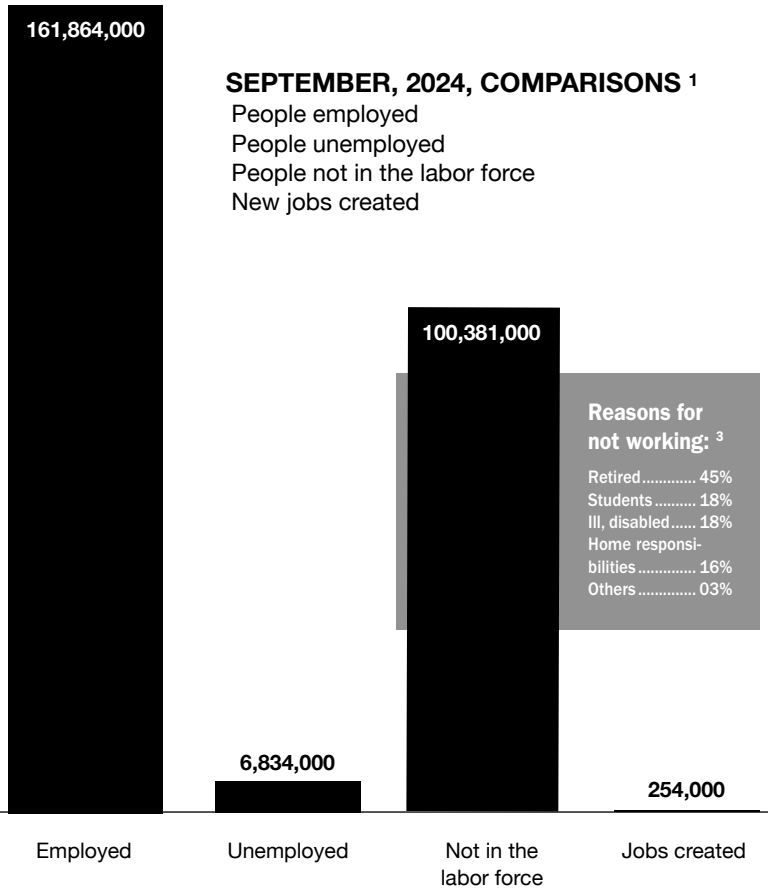
